I think the school doesn't address bullying or any aggressive behaviour seriously, and parents are kept in the dark.

Not being able to play football at break/dinner has been disappointing. Also, no school discos????

School seems to have given up all of the things that were great before covid - parent mornings, even once a month or every so often would be nice, school trips - rarely happen, class assemblies - stopped since covid, Christmas and eater discos - stopped.

I believe more notice and numerous mentions of wow days and events would be better. Also some wow days are non uniform some are uniform i have made the mistake before now of getting it wrong as i thought all wow days were uniform so that information needs to come across when mentioning wow days. I feel that there is not that much range for after school clubs mostly just football. I always find it hard to speak to staff as we are told don't speak to them before school don't message after school ect i understand they are busy but there are times we do need to speak to the teacher before of after school like if your child does not feel well in the morning or had a bad

night just to make them aware. I do fully understand that no one wants to finish work and be messaged at stupid hours but sometimes we as parents are also busy so it can be the only time we can message too. Overall i do believe my child is doing well at school and is overall mostly quite happy.

I'm just sometimes at a loss when facing school refusal, tears, tantrums, feigning illnesses from both my children each day because they don't want to go to school. This behaviour indicates they're unhappy - but I'm told they are fine and get on well during the day. Neither child can tell me anything specific. They just 'don't want to go'. It's difficult for me to make sense of and know what to do for the best.

I find it very easy to lose track of posts on Dojo as we sometimes get several notifications each day per child. I've brought this up before and I was told I was in the minority and nothing would be done about it. I've also raised issue with not being informed of events such as non-uniform or change of PE days in a timely manner and was again told it wasn't a problem - when it clearly is.

I'd love to be more involved with my child's class. Reading with them etc

Would be great if events like sports day showcased a range of skills for the children like throwing, jumping etc rather than just races which would be more inclusive. Many other schools do sports day where children move through various activities that parents watch. This is often achieved with smaller shorter sports days/ hours , just for individual years rather than whole infant / juniors.

If you put all the inset days together to make 1 week off school in maybe June for the pupils then families could be encouraged to go on holiday in off peak time helping families afford great holidays and help to reduce unauthorised absences.

A lot of join in activities is short noticed and difficult to attend unless not working.

The we PTA has been very quiet this year -from a members perspective

I was very disappointed that children weren't allowed to walk home by themselves after school events. As a single working parent this then stopped my child from attending an afterschool club.

I feel that a breakdown of the expectation of what is desired at home and performance needs to be more clearer. Communication is not always clear for the parents to understand.

It would be good if the inset days weren't tagged onto a school holiday, but were spread out a bit more across the year.

Not really sure what interventions she has, if any.

Would like more after school activities (free or paid) for Year 1

In some case more advanced notice of events. It would also be good if parent involved events were at each end of the day.
