Remote Learning Policy

Attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including for their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. However, we will consider providing remote education to pupils in circumstances where attendance in person is either not possible or does not follow any government guidance. This might include:

- When it is not safe to open school to pupils and staff
- Following advice from local or central Government that school is to remain closed
- Where an individual pupil, for a limited time, is unable to physically attend school but is able to continue to learn and complete set work.

It will only be considered as a last resort when the alternative would be no education, and only when it has been clearly established that the reason fits into one of the identified criteria listed above.

Remote Learning Expectations

Where work has been set for a pupil, it is expected that they will complete all tasks. The length of tasks will be proportionate to the pupils age and abilities and parents are encouraged to support tasks where appropriate. If a pupil is unwell, they are not expected to complete remote learning tasks. Teachers will set work either using SeeSaw, email sheets and instructions or post details on Dojo. Pupils will continue to have access to Mathletics and TTRockstars. Pupils will be encouraged to read on a daily basis throughout an absence from school. School will also share the Accelerated Reader URL with parents so that they can access quizzes from home.

Feedback and support

Teachers will keep in contact via Dojo messages, emails and phone calls to provide feedback, support and encouragement. Work posted on SeeSaw may be commented on once a week as a minimum for feedback and progression purposes.

Resources

Where possible learning will be provided through the following:

- Live lessons if a whole class is closed
- Links to websites / online learning platforms
- Worksheets and materials that may be provided for use at home

Live lesson Expectations

If a live lesson is to be used, only pupils who accept the teachers invite will be permitted to join. During live lessons all cameras and audio functions will be expected to be disabled and comments or questions posted in the chat.

Provision for pupils with SEND

Teachers will make informed judgements on how to adapt and amend activities for pupils with SEND. School will work collaboratively with families to ensure remote learning is accessible and appropriate. It may be impossible for school to provide specific and differentiated resources and therefore staff will work with the SENDco and, if necessary, the local authority, to meet its statutory duties with regards to education.

Online Safety

All pupils receive half termly lessons on online safety as part of the Computing curriculum. Regular and timely reminders are sent to parents and will be re-issued before remote learning begins, either for a class, year group or individual.
