







## Year 1 Homework Tasks for Spring Term 2 2025-26

This term children will have a choice of optional homework tasks to be handed in on set dates in addition to reading at home. These are linked to our Science and Geography topics this term. **What are the different parts of plants called and which birds do you know? And Why are some places in the world always hot and others always cold?**

Homework will be displayed in the classroom and we will have a homework sharing session where the children will present their work to the class. There are also maths focussed tasks which will link to our learning in school. These will give you an idea of what we are learning in school but do not need to be handed in although you are free to send in work or share it on Class Dojo and Seesaw.

Dojos will be awarded for completing activities.

<p>World Book Day is the 5<sup>th</sup> March. What is your favourite book? Draw the main character or the front cover and be prepared to say why it is your favourite book.</p> 	<p>Research an animal that lives in a hot or cold place. Draw a picture and write facts around it like a fact sheet.</p> 
<p>Make something at home and write a set of instructions for how you made it, for example; how you make a smoothie, how you make a sandwich or how to make a cup of tea.</p>	<p>Research either the Inuits or Eskimos. Where do they live? What clothes do they wear? What type of food do they eat? Draw a picture.</p>
<p>Perform a short poem at home. Ask an adult to record it and upload it to Seesaw or Class Dojo.</p>	<p>On a world map, mark the equator. Label a country that has a hot climate and a country that has a cold climate, for example; Kenya has a warm climate, Antarctica has a cold climate.</p>
<p>Draw and label the main parts of a plant.</p> 	<p>Keep a diary of birds you have seen in your garden for a week. Include dates, weather, location and what you saw.</p> 

## Reading and Maths Homework

The table below will give you an idea of some of the concepts that we will be covering in maths during this term. By practising each concept at home during the week it will support your child in their learning. Homework tasks for maths do not need to be handed in but if your child would like to share their maths home learning with us in school, then they are very welcome to bring it in or, alternatively it can be shared on Dojo or Seesaw.

<u>Week 1</u> 23.2.26	Place Value to 50 Count from 20 to 50.	<u>Week 2</u> 2.3.26	Place Value to 50 20, 30, 40 and 50.	<u>Week 3</u> 9.3.26	Place Value to 50 Count by making groups of 10.
<u>Week 4</u> 16.3.26	Place Value to 50 Groups of 10s and 1s.	<u>Week 5</u> 23.3.26	Place Value to 50 Partition into 10s and 1s.
