Maths

We will be covering a variety of areas this half term including shape, area and perimeter. A big well done to every child who is regularly using Times Table Rockstars and Mathletics at home - it really is wonderful to see so many children engaging with their maths learning at home!

PE

Literacy

Our Literacy lessons will be linked to our History topic, all about WW2. Children will start the half-term by writing a non-chronological report all about different aspects of war. We will then delve deeper into the topic and what it was like to live throughout the war, by writing a letter from an evacuee.

Reading is a vital skill that supports all areas of children's learning. It is important that children are reading regularly to adults at home and having their homework diary signed to complete the reading challenge.

Science

Our Science topic continues with 'What is electrical power and how does it vary?' We will be creating a range of exciting electrical investigations using the circuit equipment in school!

Topic
