Our Offer



The Nursery offers places for 26 children per session. Longmoor Nursery caters for children who are 3 and 4 years old. Children must be 3 years old the term before they start at Longmoor Nursery. We also offer places for 30 hours provision using government funding based on eligibility



The timings we offer are:

Morning Session - Monday to Friday, 8:45am - 11.45pm

Afternoon Session - Monday to Friday, 12.30pm - 3.30pm

Full Day - Monday to Friday, 8.45am - 3.30pm

Where there are insufficient places available to meet all parental preferences, we offer a waiting list. In line with Government guidance, priority allocation of Nursery places will be given to Children in Care. Allocation priority is then given to siblings of children in school, and to local residents.

If you wish to split your allocation of extended hours with another provider, please discuss this with our office staff and ensure this is stated on the relevant admission paperwork.

Assessment

Early Years Framework (September 2021)

Throughout the year children's progress is reviewed against the Early Years Outcomes. Children who are working within 'typical' expectations for Nursery will be working within the '3 and 4 year olds' section or each of the Areas of Development. The Characteristics of Effective Learning describe key dispositions which play a central role in your child becoming an effective learner in readiness for school.

Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning
Playing and Exploring Children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'.
Active Learning Children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements.
Creating and Thinking Critically Children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things.

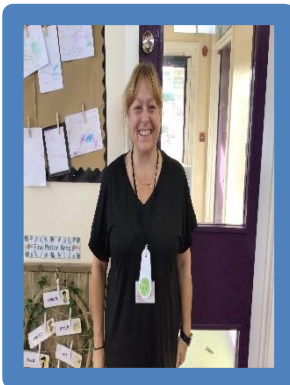

Why send your child to Nursery?



The early years of a child's life are very important. Before the age of five your child will go through their most rapid period of development physically, socially, emotionally and intellectually. During this time your child will be full of curiosity as they try to make sense of the world around them. Children learn best through first hand experiences, exploration, talk and play.

We strive to provide an interesting environment, in which the children can be actively involved in their learning. We provide a broad, balanced, relevant curriculum working in partnership with parents and the wider community.

In the Nursery we value our children and aim to meet the needs of each individual child. We aim to help our children to develop into confident, competent and caring people.

Please note that a place in Longmoor Nursery does not guarantee a place for your child in Longmoor Primary School Reception Class.

Parents of children wishing to enter Reception must complete a separate application form, available from Derbyshire County Council.

Places are allocated according to the Admissions Policy, a copy of which is available in school.

Home-Nursery Links

During the children's settling in period, the Nursery staff like to spend time with you and your child. We want you to provide us with as much information as you can about your child, to enable us to cater for their individual needs. This is an ideal opportunity to mention any concerns you may have about your child, especially any medical conditions.

We actively welcome help from parents in many capacities both in the Nursery and the School. Those willing to join in the Nursery will be given guidance in participating. Activities parents could help with may include reading stories, baking or participating in our Wow days- please look on our class web page for dates and also refer to our Dojo page to inform you of what we are learning each day.



The Nursery operates a home-school lending service where each week you can borrow a book from Nursery to read at home with your child. We carefully monitor each child's progress through the year and the opportunity is given to parents to discuss their child's progress with the Nursery teachers in October and March. Your child's teacher records any achievements and any progress made in an individual Learning Journey online on a journal which you will have access to via your own individual login. Parents are encouraged to support their child's learning by adding their own observations to their child's Tapestry journal. A written report is also sent home at the end of each Nursery Year.

A Typical day in nursery



The following is an example of our daily timetable which can change during a session.

9.00

Sit down for register/carpet session input (pre-phonics, number/topic work).

9.15-10.30

Children encouraged to work with an adult on a play based input, at the child's appropriate stage of development, alongside inside/outdoor free flow play using adult modelling and interactions.

10.30

Snack, followed by indoor and outdoor play, guided by adults

11.10: Tidy up time indoor and outdoor.

11.20: Story time and singing.

11.35: Getting ready for home time.

11.45: Home time

Our Afternoon sessions mirror this plan, however for children staying with us for 30 hours we extend our morning activities and use planned interventions to meet the children's needs.

Please feel free to make an appointment for a visit to see what we do in Nursery!



Helpful Hints

- School uniform is optional, however, we do encourage children to wear uniform as it helps them feel part of our school. It also helps to save nice clothing when we are getting messy!
- Please mark clearly your child's clothes, shoes and coats.
- Jewellery is not allowed in the Nursery. Earrings must be studs and necklaces are especially dangerous and can get easily lost or broken.
- Please do not send your child to Nursery if they are ill. If they have been unwell through the night, please keep them at home the next day. Infections spread very quickly in a group of small children. We have a 48 hour policy for vomiting and diarrhoea.
- Unfortunately we are unable to give medicine in the Nursery unless prescribed by their GP.
- Please make sure that we have an emergency telephone number where we can contact you or another named person.
- Please inform a member of staff of any change in home circumstances which you feel may affect your child's behaviour/well-being in school.
- During the day we offer snack, milk or water and fruit. We ask for £1 per week to contribute to snack and baking.
- All children must be collected by an adult. If someone other than a parent is collecting your child, please inform the Nursery staff with a memorable password.
- We encourage reading and talking/playing at home to develop language and social skills
- Please support independent toilet skills in preparation for nursery
