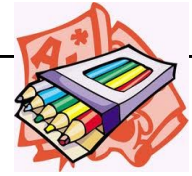




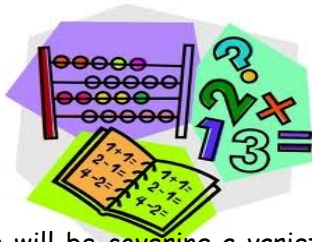
Year 6 News

Maths



We will be covering a variety of areas this half term including ratio, area and perimeter and statistics. This half term, the children have their SATs week (commencing 11th May) and therefore will be revising many of their previous maths skills too.

Literacy

This half term, we also have exciting class books to read. Dolphins will be reading *The Midnight Swan* by Catherine Fisher and Cheetahs will be reading *Oliver Twist* by Charles Darwin)

SATs

SATs week is the fifth week of this half term (the week commencing Monday 11th May). Running up to this week, we will be holding in-school revision sessions and extra support for the all children. Science



Our new Science topic for this half term is called, 'Why is the heart the most important pump we own?' This topic is focused on the circulatory and respiratory system. In our lessons, the children will be, conducting experiments to test heart rate and identifying parts of the heart and lungs!
