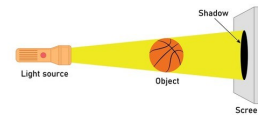


### Science

### PE

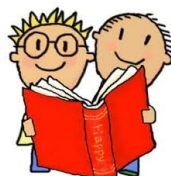
